

Highlights from activities of EURAMET TC-Q 2011

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5th EURAMET GA Sarajevo, BiH, 6 to 9 June 2011

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New TC-Q documents

- QMS review procedure + Guide on peer review visits inclusive a template of a report (a task from BoD)
- crucial point: should on-site visits by peers in self-declared institutes be mandatory or not?
- BoD decision, August 2010: a nonmandatory system of on-site visits adopted, on-site visits strongly recommended (especially for institutes from new EU Member States!)

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New TC-Q documents

- on the other hand, institutes submitting their CMCs for the first time will have to go through an on-site visit by peers
- both documents have been extensively discussed in TC-Q and finally approved at the last TC-Q meeting (March 2011)
- a new project launched: simplification of template for annual reports – ideally to be finished in autumn 2011

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The case of LATMB Latvia

- LATMB CMCs in M,L and EM in the greyed-out zone
- to reinstate them a peer review visit was made by Andreas Odin of PTB Germany in 6/2010
- after the findings had been settled BIPM was asked to reinstate them
- everything finalized in 9/2010

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External auditing - survey

- EURAMET challenged by the other RMOs for not making any on-site external auditing in self-declared institutes
- the options are:
 - accreditation (by an ILAC MRA signatory)
 - on-site visit by peers (inclusive an internal audit with external auditors)
 - an audit made by the corresponding NMI (applicable only to A-DIs)

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External auditing - survey

- a survey of the situation was made in 5/2010 separately for NMIs and A-DIs
- only institutes with registered or submitted CMCs have been taken into account
- considerable information on these issues is "hidden" in annual reports
- after an evaluation of the survey TC Chair initiated consultations with corresponding contact persons about what can be done to rectify the situation

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External auditing - results: NMIs

 there were only 4 NMIs with approved or submitted CMCs without any coverage by either accreditation or participation in voluntary peer review visits:

NSAI NML Ireland, JV Norway, SMD Belgium, ENEA-INMRI Italy and DMDM Serbia

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External auditing - results: NMIs

NSAI NML Ireland:

- the situation discussed with CMI
- a new on-site visit by peers will be registered: CMI Czech Republic will assess the QMS itself and the fields of pressure and acoustics in NML in summer 2011

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External auditing – results: NMIs

JV Norway:

- in 2010 JV invited foreign experts to review two technical area of our laboratories:
 - mass, reviewed by Dr. Lars Nielsen, DFM, Denmark, on Nov 15 2011
 - humidity, reviewed by Mr. Anders Bonde Kentved, Delta, Denmark, on Oct 14 2010
- earlier flow and length were reviewed by foreign experts, as reported in annual reports

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External auditing - results: NMIs

JV Norway:

further reviews are planned for 2011

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External auditing - results: NMIs

SMD Belgium:

- since 28 of July 2010 the approved CMC's are covered by an RvA accreditation - accreditation number K146
- since 01/02/2011 the RvA
 accreditation K146 was transferred to
 BELAC (Belgian accreditation
 organisation) under accreditation no.
 BELAC 425-CAL (this transfer is due to
 the EC 765/2008 regulation regarding
 Cross Frontier Policy in accreditation)

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External auditing - results: NMIs

DMDM Serbia:

- DMDM is currently involved in the process of accreditation of two labs:
 - laboratory for dimensional measurements
 - laboratory for testing of electricity meters
- there are two accreditation bodies involved, Hellenic Accreditation System
 ESYD (EA MLA signatory) and
 - Accreditation Body of Serbia- ATS

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External auditing - results: NMIs

DMDM Serbia:

- it is a joint accreditation, at the moment finalized
- there is a plan to extend accreditation to cover additional fields

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External auditing - results: NMIs

ENEA-INMRI Italy:

- a communication with Director P. De Felice
- agreed that an on-site peer review visit will be made by the end of 2011 within the peer review group of Spain, Portugal and Italy (TC-Q project no. 1123)

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External auditing - conclusion: NMIs

The conclusion:

All the EURAMET NMIs are covered (or being covered) by accreditation by an ILAC MRA signatory or by on-site visits by peers!

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External auditing - results: DIs

- TC-Q Secretary together with EURAMET Secretary made in 4/2010 an extensive survey of DIs to clean up incomplete paperwork concerning them and
- to review the requirements for them and how they are fulfilled
- discussions are under way at both the JCRB and EURAMET levels how to limit the number of DIs

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External auditing – results: DIs

Out of the 68 A-DIs which were registered in October 2009 (the situation as of 8/2010):

- 58 A-DIs provided the information (in general in a quite complete form);
- 3 A-DIs decided to terminate their Associate status;
- 7 A-DIs formerly did not reply but up to now they provided the required information

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External auditing - results: DIs

LNE-SYRTE, LNE-INM: are regularly peerreviewed in a 5-year period (next ones by the end of 2012)

LNE-ENSAM: greyed-out CMCs, no annual report so far delivered → even the French delegare inclined to withdraw their CMCs completely, TC-Q Chair has asked the Chairman to take it up with BIPM

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External auditing - results: DIs

NILU Norway: no CMCs, only 1 calibration

per annum

PMOD-WRC Switzerland: audited in the framework of WMO (but problems)

All the other A-DIs are either accredited, peer reviewed or audited by their respective NMI!

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Acceptance criteria - DIs

QMS reviews in RMOs are the last in the chain \rightarrow no major changes in membership can realistically be expected

Problems as seen by TC-Q:

- specifications of service categories in the testing area as made by BIPM contain "gaps" (specifications like "Other")
- the specification of service categories should ideally be made narrower (around primary methods with clear-cut traceability?), to avoid matrix materials

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Cooperation with "technical" TCs

- technical TC Chairs have been explicitly asked to make available to TC-Q any information about underperformance of any institute in intercomparisons or about any info raising concern relevant to their QS life
- this will subsequently be used by TC-Q to make decisions about possible onsite visit by peers (required by TC-Q)
- strategy: an attempt to pursuade CEC
 DG EI to suport KCs/SCs in EURAMET

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JCRB/BIPM

ILAC-BIPM communication on accreditation of NMIs: technical experts will have to possess necessary qualification to make assessments

- What will be the status of this document within ILAC?
- we have to be careful not to necessarily involve in this system all the calibrations made by NMIs, e.g. those secondary ones
- TC-Q does not intend to make any more special requirements

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JCRB/BIPM

CIPM MRA Addendum in 2 steps:

- 1. up-date, editorial changes, approval of the procedure for amendments
- 2. changes in the process of CMC approval?

At the next JCRB meeting it should be on the agenda: first thoughts on future changes

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- the accreditation system
- EA has raised the issue concerning recognition of calibrations made by accredited calibration laboratories for traceability purposes within CIPM MRA - a mirror reflection of what is written on the issue in P 10 applicable within **CIPM MRA**

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
