

APMP Report to EURAMET, May 2013

1. Update of membership status

There was no change to the number of APMP Full Member Economies in 2012, which is currently 22 (involving 37 institutes). At the recent APMP meetings held in Wellington, New Zealand, the Dubai Central Laboratory Department was approved by the General Assembly as a new Associate Member, bringing the total number of Associate Members to 7.

The most recent membership application received is from the Designated Reference Institute for Chemical Measurements (DRiCM), Bangladesh. Pending unanimous approval by APMP full members, the DRiCM membership should be finalised by the end of May 2013.

- The Designated Reference Institute for Chemical Measurements (DRICM) of the Bangladesh Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (BCSIR) has been recognized as a designated institute in the area of chemical metrology.
- Under the CIPM MRA, the Hangzhou Applied Acoustics Research Institute (HAARI), China, has been recognized as a designated institute in the area of Underwater Acoustics

2. Update of personnel

2.1 Chairperson and Secretariat:

Dr Laurie Besley, the previous CEO and Chief Metrologist of NMI Australia, became APMP Chairperson at the 2012 APMP meetings in December in New Zealand. He replaced Prof. Yu Yadong, the Vice Director of NIM, China. The change of Chairperson means that the APMP Secretariat has now been transferred from NIM (China) to NMIA (Australia) where it will be based for the next three years. Ms. Noleen Grogan (NMI, Australia) has taken on the role of APMP Secretary from Ms. Ada Juan Cai, NIM China.

2.2 Executive Committee (EC):

3. Highlights of APMP GA 2012

The 28th APMP General Assembly and related activities were held from November 25th- 30th 2012 in Wellington, New Zealand. The Measurement Standards Laboratory, NZ, took excellent care of over 300 participants from over 20 APMP member economies along with invited leaders and experts from a number of other international and regional bodies.

Meetings and activities included:

- General Assembly
- Executive Committee (EC) meetings, Technical Committee Chairs' (TCC) meeting, EC-TCC meeting
- Annual meetings of 12 Technical Committees (TCs) and the Developing Economies' Committee (DEC)
- The 3rd APMP <u>NMI Directors' Workshop</u> on "Interaction with the Accreditation Bodies and/or Legal Metrology Bodies"
- A Symposium on "Measuring the Measurers"
- Workshops and Seminars organized by specific TCs (eg pressure and vacuum, metrology in chemistry, quality systems, electrical metrology)

Key decisions of the General Assembly include approvals of:

- 1) The APMP Work plan and the Budget plan for 2013;
- 2) The Associate Membership of Dubai Central Laboratory Department;
- 3) The Working Group on Materials Metrology to become a full Technical Committee. Note that the scope of this Technical Committee covers measurements relevant to

advanced materials and nanotechnology;

- 4) Signing of the MoU with PTB and the Joint Declaration with UNIDO
- 5) TC Initiatives which will receive funding from the APMP for 2013 include the approved proposals from temperature, photometry and radiometry, length and acoustics, ultrasound and vibration technical committees.

4. Other Meetings:

4.1 APEC SCSC1 and the Specialist Regional Bodies (SRB) Forum meetings

APMP representatives attended the APEC SCSC1 and the Specialist Regional Bodies (SRB) Forum meetings in Jakarta, Indonesia (January 2013). These meetings provide the opportunity to maintain and foster good relationships with other specialist regional bodies, as well as strengthen linkages with APEC economies within the Standards and Conformance area.



Of interest:

- Asia Pacific Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation is now the nominated SRB representative to the APEC Food Safety Cooperation Forum (FSCF) Partnership Training Institute Network (PTIN). APMP worked with the Regional Metrology Organization (SIM) in the Americas to develop and carry out APEC Project CTI 21 20011T which focused on developing laboratory capabilities within the APEC economies in measuring toxic contaminants in seafood (report published July 2012, with a final report to be released shortly).
- APMP and APLAC have signed an MoU to support enhanced cooperation between the two SRBs in proficiency testing programs
- APMP and APLMF are looking to develop joint activities which will fall under the MoU signed between the two SRBs.

4.2 30th JCRB Meeting and Related Workshop

A number of APMP representatives participated in the 30th JCRB meeting and related workshop held in Paris, France, in March 2013. APMP members played an active role in the discussions and outcomes of the workshop which dealt with the CMC submission and review process. The next JCRB meeting will be hosted by APMP in Beijing, China, in September 2013.

5. Forthcoming meetings:

The APMP mid-year meetings will be held in Colombo, Sri Lanka (MUSSD) in June (24-28) 2013.

The 29th APMP GA and related meetings will be held in Chinese Taipei from 24-29 November 2013 and will be hosted by the member from Chinese Taipei, CMS-ITRI.
