# 1 Report of the cofunding cost related to the activities described in Part E of the Annual Report

Previously submitted Part E of the Annual Report (cofunded activities) together with this Part F (cofunded costs) detail the cofunding contributed by the Partnership Participating countries. Costs reported here are compiled from the National Cofunding financial reports submitted in accordance with the Cofunding Reporting Strategy approved by the Metrology Partnership Committee according to relevant provisions of the Metrology Decision (EU) 2021/2084. Scope of the National Cofunding activities is given in Section 1.1 of the Part E.

Part E of the Annual Report describes the activities reported in 2023, while this this document gives a cumulative summary of costs reported trough the lifetime of the Partnership, including draft costs reported in 2023. This Report should not be seen as a fully comprehensive list of all National Metrology institute (NMI) and Designated Institute (DI) costs that are funded from the national resources.

## 1.1 Cumulative Total Cofunding costs by Year

At the time of writing this report, 18% of target has been incurred in 2022 and fully reported, with a further 5% of 2022 costs awaiting CFS, and a further 24% of target is made up of 2023 costs currently reported in draft format. The graph below indicates that the reporting is progressing significantly ahead of linear plan, and we forecast to meet the target before the end of the programme.

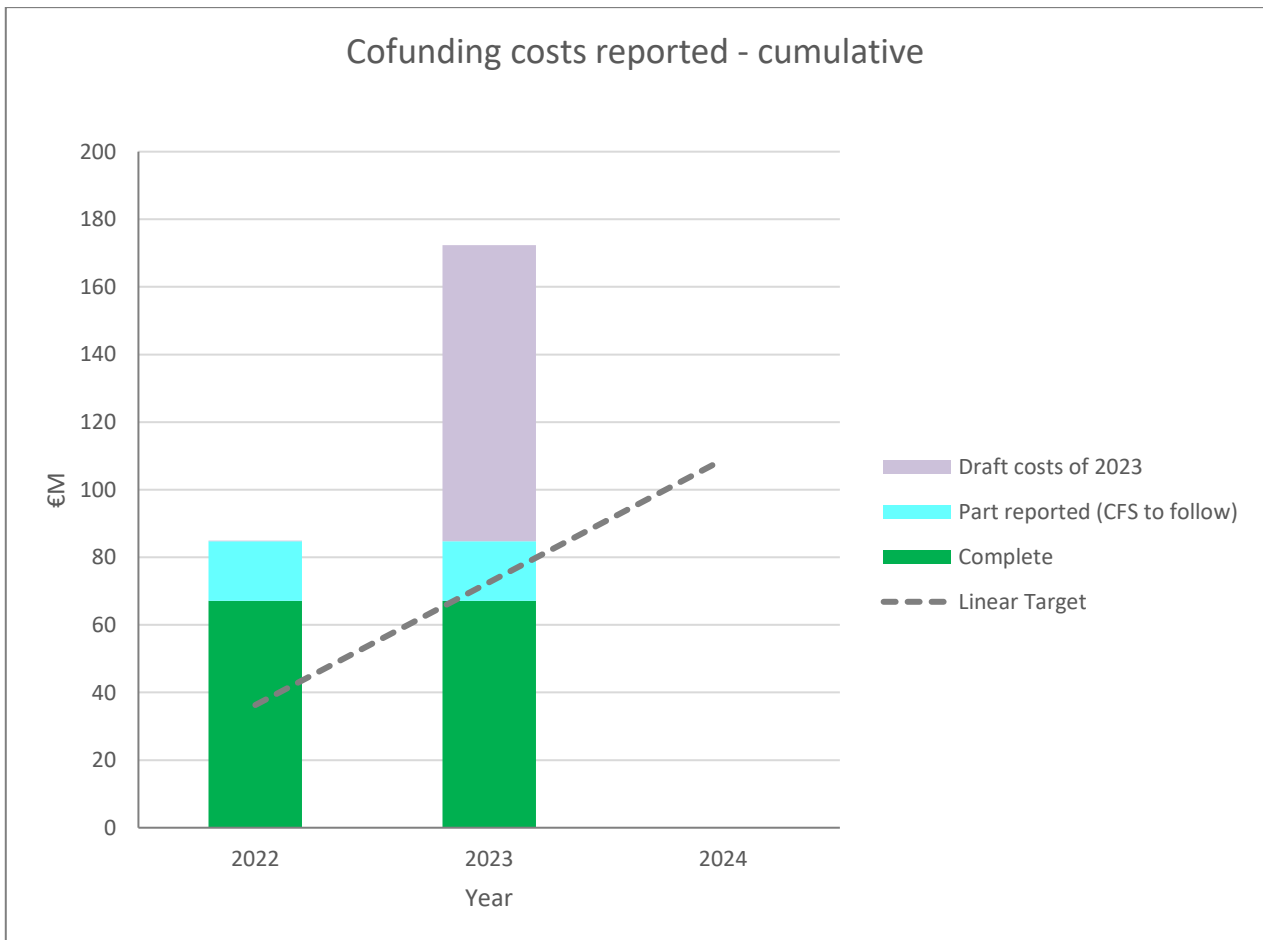


Figure 1. Status of Costs reported.

## 1.2 Cumulative Cofunding cost by country

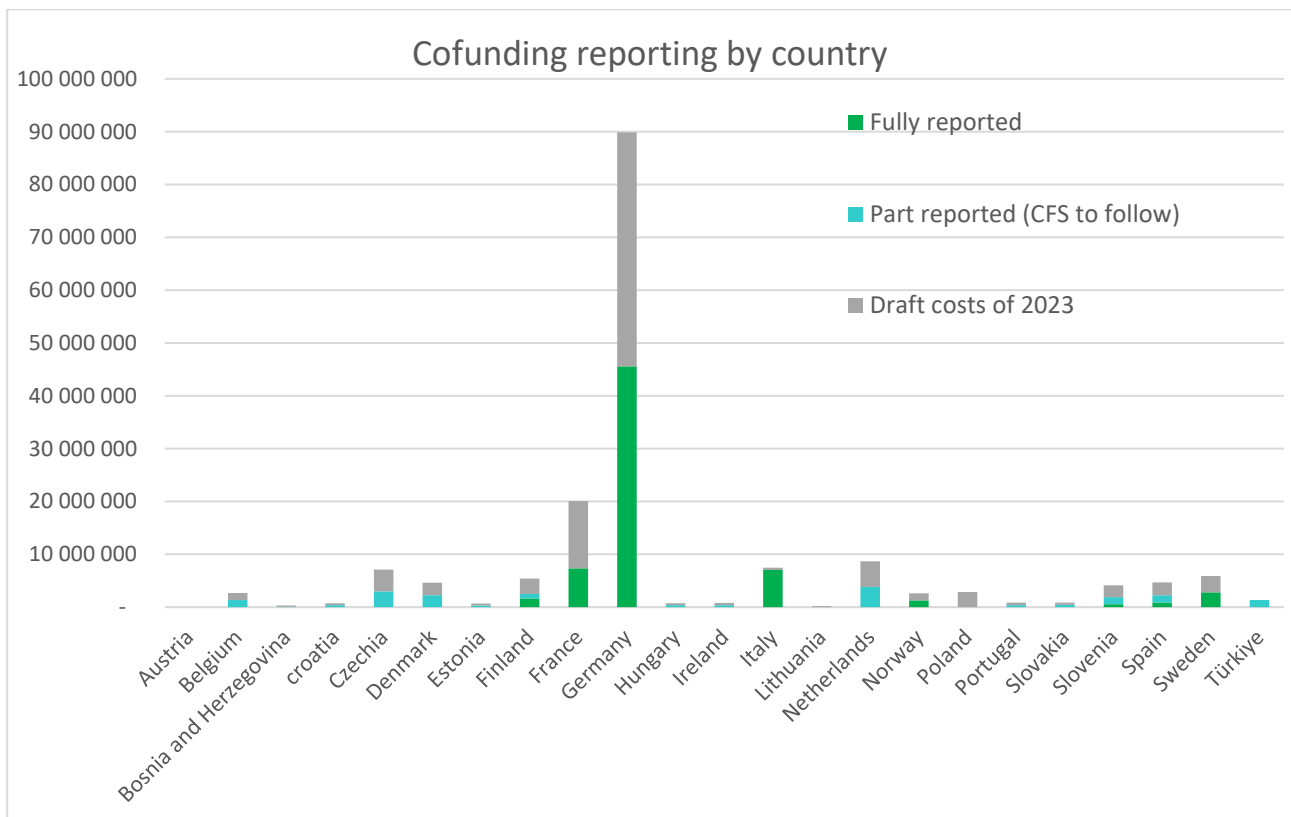


Figure 2. Cumulative Cofunding Reporting by country for 2023.

Figure 2 depicts the situation of co-funding reporting for the Partnership implementation until the end of 2023. Year 2023 was the second full year of reporting, and the relative distribution of cofunding contribution among the participating countries is likely to change over the lifetime of the Partnership. Although some countries had not submitted a draft at the time of writing this report, it is anticipated that all will submit a report by the agreed deadline of June 2023 for inclusion in next years cumulative report.

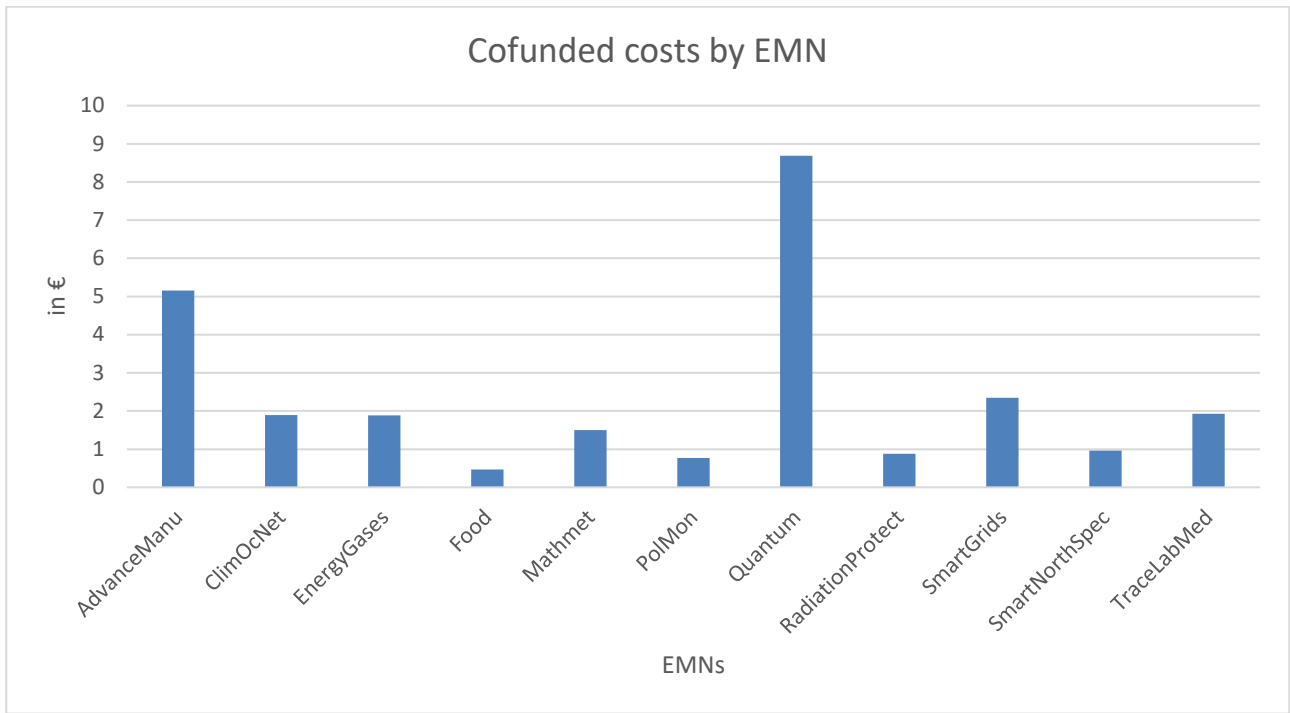


Figure 3. Cofunded costs by EMN.
